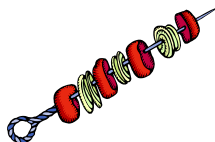
Cookery Corner— *Fruit Kebab*

Skewer it—An ideal way to cook on the barbecue.

Choose firm, chunky fruit that will hold together. Fruits such as pineapple, apple and banana work well, and can be brushed with a mix of fruit juice, brown sugar so they caramelize on the grill.

They don't need much cooking, and are best cooked on a clean barbecue, so they don't pick up meat or fish flavours.

They could always be cooked first, and kept warm in the oven.

Useful Household Tips

- Silver can be cleaned with a paste of bicarbonate of soda and water. Use 3 tablespoons of bicarb to one of warm water. Spread over object and let dry. Polish with a soft, clean cloth.
- Beetroot stains: cover stains immediately with a slice of bread which has been soaked in water.
- Chewing gum: to remove rub with an ice cube. The gum will harden and peel off quite easily.
- To stop bananas going brown after adding them to a fruit salad just hold them under a cold tap after peeling.
