A' Level Moving Image Arts

As part of my Moving Image Arts A' Level course, I organised a visit to the Amma Centre - a digital learning centre in Armagh. For my pre-production piece, which is an exercise aimed at experimenting with a particular visual effect, I wanted to project an image of a person onto

various background shots of film which I had taken. For example, I could superimpose a shot of someone over a motorway to give the impression that the person was on the motorway. The process involves standing in front of a green or blue screen so that the background colour can be keyed out during the editing process. Keying out is the name given to the process of taking away certain colours from a picture. This then enables the mixing of two images. It is a process used in televised weather forecasts. During the visit to the Amma centre we were assisted by the staff to create a professional setup using lighting and camera equipment. In my final edit, I used footage from Citizen Kane alongside my own footage to create an eclectic and imaginative product that I am proud of. Katie kindly agreed to act for me.
